

Care for Creation – Plant a Tree!

Why trees?!

How do I get started?

Tree planting is not hard, but it's worth thinking through a plan to ensure success. With a little care, you should be able to give a good start to your new tree.

- First, decide where you want to plant the tree, and choose a tree that works well in that environment.
- Think of how much sunlight it will get, the soil quality and moisture as you choose a tree.
- Also watch how much room is available for the tree remember that they will grow!
- Finally, be sure to dig a hole that's big enough (2-3 times bigger than the root ball or container), and amend the soil with organic material if it needs it.

What do I do once I've planted the tree?

You're not done once it's in the ground!

Make sure to water the tree as it's getting established, especially if it's a dry time of year.

Avoid fertilizing while the tree gets established, but lightly mulching around the tree, keeping the mulch away from the trunk.
